- 🔄 Work with partners who can help to advance our goals.

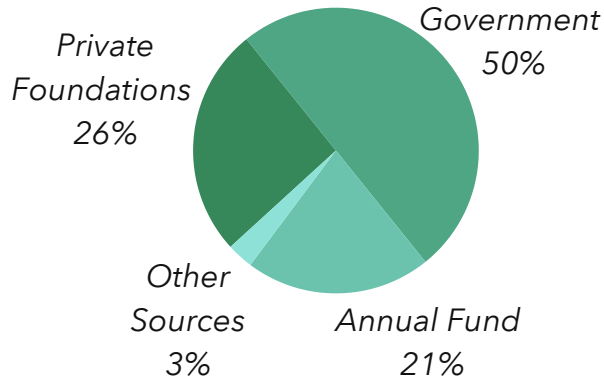


Our Model

Everything we do is guided by the principles of trust, dignity, respect and cultural sensitivity, equity, and collaborative action.

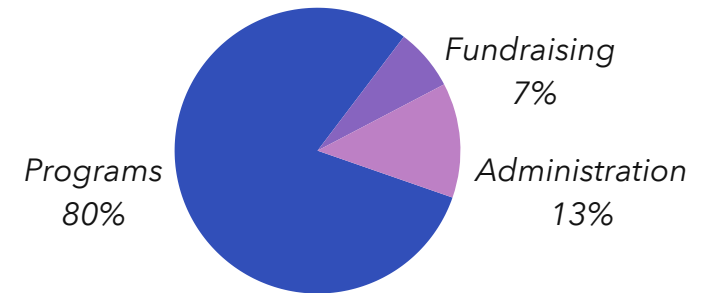
Funding Sources
